Victim Support Finland (VS)

VS guides and supports crime victims, their close ones and witnesses of crime. Services are mainly based on voluntary work. The volunteers are carefully selected and professionally guided.

All our services are strictly confidential. VS service approach is clientbased in all cases, meaning that the client decides on what action to take. All VS services are free of charge (except local telephone costs.)

VS is run in cooperation by: The Federation of Mother and Child Homes and Shelters, The Finnish Association for Mental Health, Mannerheim League of Child Welfare, The Finnish Red Cross, Finnish Federation of Settlements, The Feminist Association Union and Church council.

Resources

Central office, eight regional offices, 26 local service points, 20 persons as paid staff and 305 trained volunteers. Activities are funded mainly by Finland's Slot Machine Association (RAY) and the state.

VS is for you if

- you are a victim of crime
- you suspect that you are a victim of crime someone close to you has been a victim of crime
- you have witnessed a crime
- you want to talk about your crime experience

SUPPORT PERSONS

Crime victims, their close ones and witnesses may obtain a support person provided by VS when necessary. The support person can accompany you when attending police hearings or court sessions and assist you in applying for restraining order or compensation. With support person you may discuss about your experiences and consider further actions. Support persons are carefully chosen and trained volunteers.

Ulrik is a Victim Support's developmental project aiming to improve VS services targeted to crime victims and witnesses with foreign backgrounds. Aim is also to create tools to identify victims of human trafficking.
