When a crime is done due to the victim's ethnic or national background, sexual orientation, sex or gender identity, religion or belief or disability,

it is a case of hate crime.

If you have become a victim or witness of crime, report it to the police!

Everyone has the right to dignified non-discriminatory treatment.  
**Report hate crimes to the police!**

It is important that all matters related to the crime are reported to the police, including your suspicions of any possible motive.

The police are obliged to investigate, whether there is a hate motive in the background of the crime. The sentence resulting from the crime may be increased, if it is a case of hate crime.
